

# Catch-Up Premium

## Pupil Premium - Catch-up Premium

### What is the Year 7 Catch-Up Premium?

The Year 7 Catch-Up Premium is a stream of funding that a school receives in addition to core funding. The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support year 7 pupils who did not achieve at least level 4 in reading and/or maths at the end of key stage 2 (KS2). Schools receive an additional £500 for each pupil in year 7, who fulfils this criteria.

The Head of School on behalf of the Governing Body can decide how that funding is spend and is accountable for ensuring it has maximum impact.

### How much does the school get?

For the academic year 2015-2016, the allocation for The North School is **£21,500.00**.

### 2015-2016 Focus:

Raising attainment for pupils, who arrived at The North School with literacy and numeracy KS2 levels below level 4c.

### How are we using the Catch-Up Premium and what impact will it have?

The money is used to provide additional staffing and resources that enable the students to access a curriculum and additional programmes that are bespoke and shaped for their literacy/numeracy, and social/emotional needs.

Additional resources (site/staff, materials) to aid the Accelerate reading programme for students, who have a RA that is below their chronological age (delivery of Vocabulary Building Programme, Narrative Intervention programme etc.)	Marked increase of individual students' Reading Age matching their chronological age will ensure that students can access relevant curriculum texts and improve their overall confidence and achievement	£3.5k
