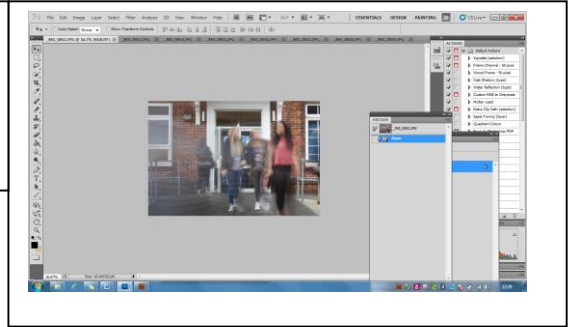
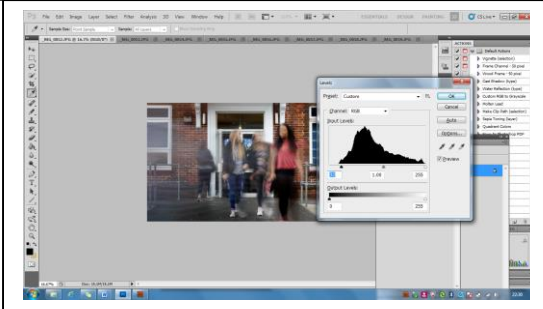


Creating a Multiple Image in Photoshop

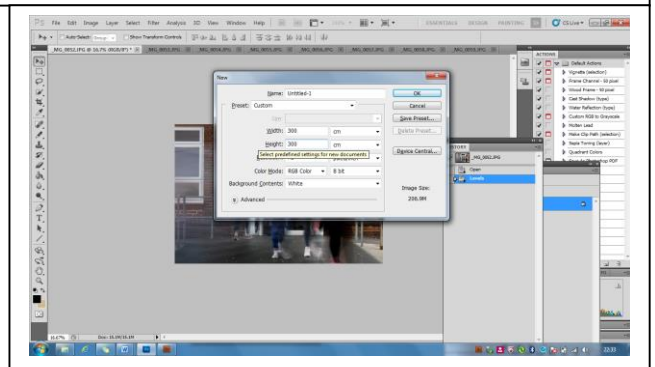
1. Open the images you want to include on your multiple Image in Photoshop ensure layers is open using **history**,




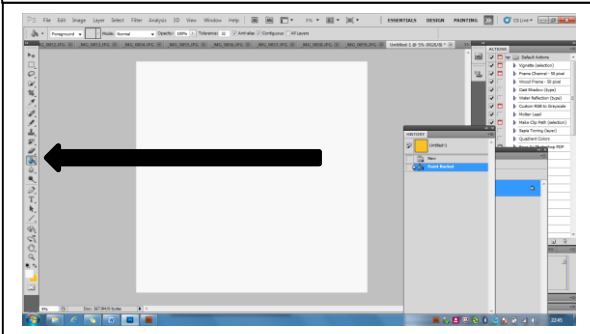
2. Adjust each image to gain the correct tonal range etc. You may want to change each image to **black/white** for example.



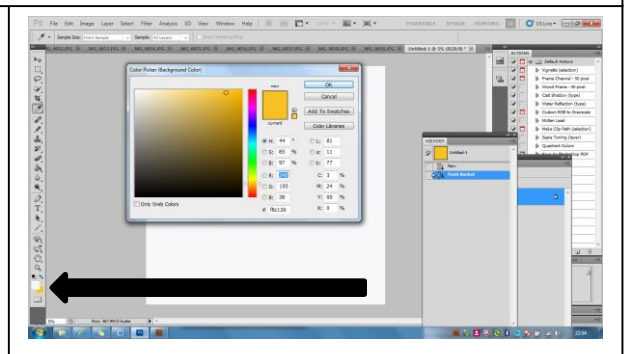
3. **Ctrl & N** makes a new canvas. Change size to 400cm x 400cm or larger. This can be cropped or enlarged at any time. You can also make the background different colours.



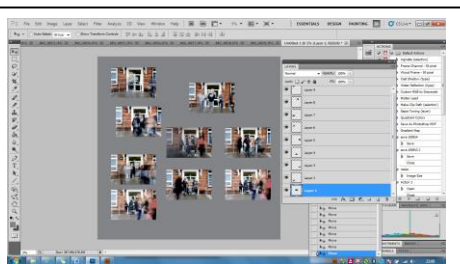
4. To change the background colour, go to the tool bar on the left and click paint bucket .



5. Click on colour picker, choose your colour. (Avoid over powering colours.) Then click the paint bucket tool over the new canvas and it will change colour.



6. Now select each image with **Ctrl & A**, copy with **Ctrl & C**. Use **Ctrl & V** to copy onto the new canvas.



7. Using layers, move each image around the canvas until you are happy with the layout.

8. Crop to your desired shape and size.

9. Layer and flatten, then save as a JPEG size 8.

10. Don't forget to keep print screens as you go along for AO2 and AO3 evidence.
