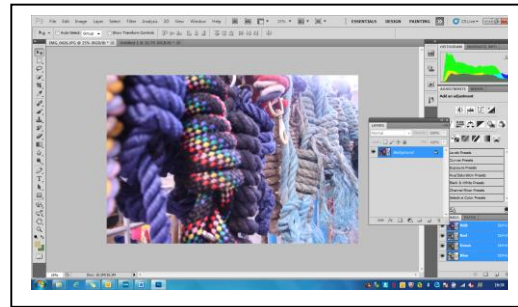
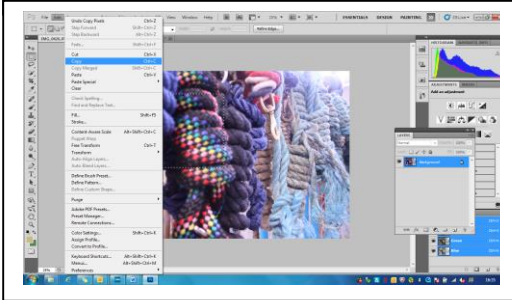


## Creating a repeated image in the style of Horst V Horst

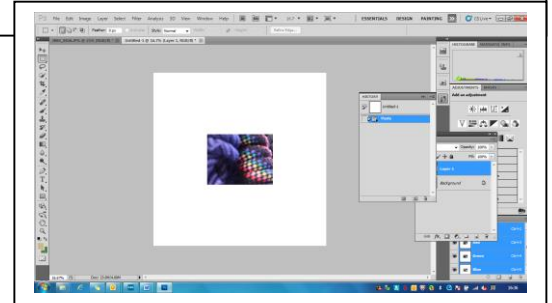
1. Open an image in Photoshop ensure layers is open using **history, layers**.



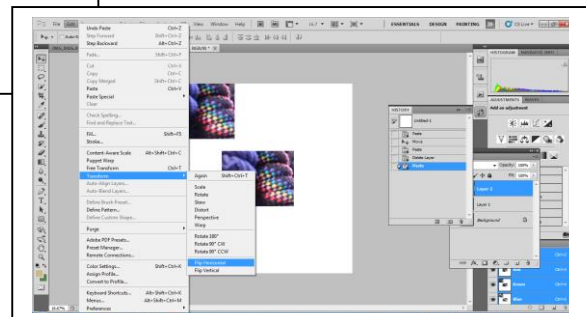
2. Use the rectangular marquee tool to select an area. **Ctrl & C** to copy.



3. **Ctrl & N** to make a new canvas. Change size to 100cm x 100 cm or larger. This can be cropped at any time. **Ctrl & V** to paste selection onto new canvas



4. Use **move** tool to move selection where you want it. **Ctrl & V** will paste again. You can work on/move each area you have selected using layers. Flip selection with edit, **transform, flip vertical/horizontal**. Repeat three times, pasting, flipping horizontally and vertically to create a basic 4 part repeated pattern. Layer, flatten, save.



### EXTENSION

Go to layer, and ensure you have flattened.

Use rectangular marquee tool to select the whole pattern.

You can make the canvas larger or crop at any time.

Ctrl & C. Ctrl & V.

Move pieces to create an 8 part, 16 part or more repeated pattern.

Crop to chosen size. Flatten.

Adjust curves, levels etc to your taste

Save as a jpeg into the print folder and your own area.
